ATIS Task Force

The ATIS Task Force was established in 2003 to address issues related to travel information in the corridor. The Task Force was comprised of Coalition member volunteers with a mission to provide direction for future travel information endeavors in the corridor.

The Task Force was tasked with responding to the following seven questions:

1. If there were a clear vision for ATIS in the Corridor, how would we best describe it?
2. What specific goals/objectives should we strive to achieve?
3. How would we measure success in achieving them?
4. What have we learned about public/private partnerships and business models for ATIS to date?
5. What is the public sector role in ATIS?
6. What opportunities exist for public/private partnerships related to Coalition projects/activities?
7. In recognition of the Coalition's three primary strategies of information sharing, facilitating deployment, and information management – what types of projects/activities should be the focus of our efforts?

The vision statement established a vision for future work:

“Transportation users have ready access to accurate and timely Corridor-wide multi-modal travel information to assist them in making trip decisions.”

The group also identified four goals for travel information in the Corridor Coalition:

1. Advance the concept of inter- and multi-modal ATIS throughout the Corridor
2. Seamlessly integrate 511 Corridor-wide
3. Ensure consistent data quality Corridor-wide
4. Use traveler information for operations and vice versa
